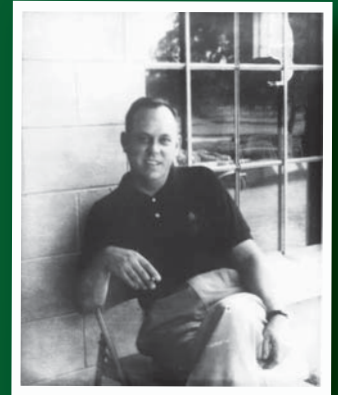

Whether you're a junior golfer, a competitive player, or just play for fun, Meadowbrook Country Club will surpass your expectations.

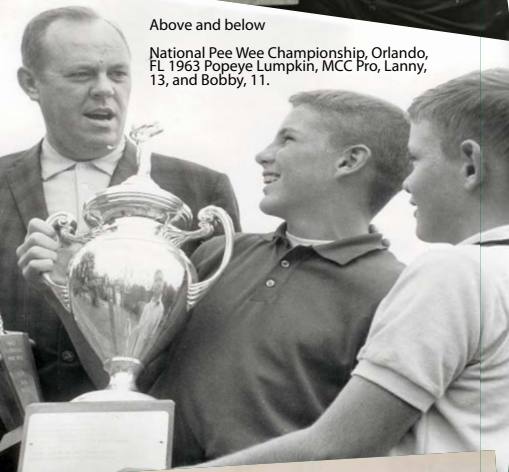

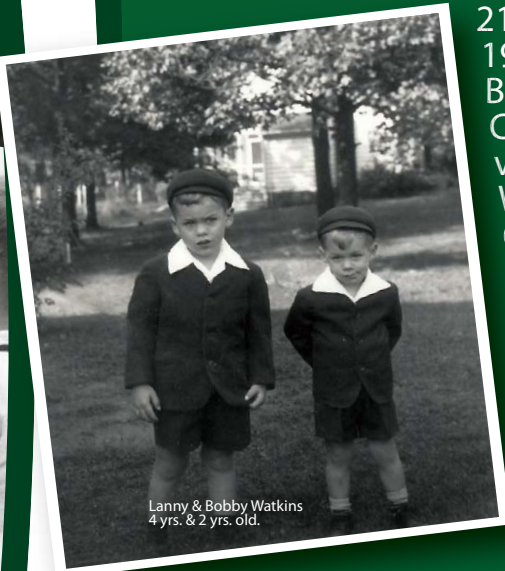

Jerry Lanston "Lanny" Wadkins, Jr., won 21 times on the PGA tour including the 1977 PGA Championship at Pebble Beach and the 1979 Players Championship at Sawgrass. He was voted PGA Player of the Year in 1985. Wadkins was elected to the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2009.

Robert (Bobby) Edwin Wadkins won the 1971 Virginia State Amateur and turned pro in 1973. He went on to win ten times as a professional, including four times on the CHAMPIONS tour. He has also notched professional wins in Europe and Asia, and has been a three time winner of the Virginia State Open.



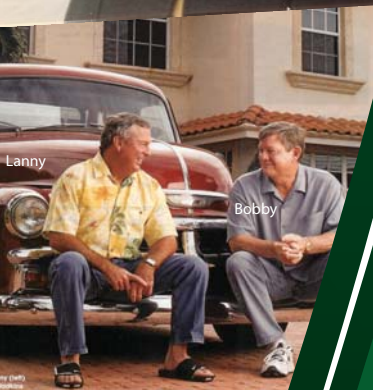

John Rollins has won three times on the PGA Tour, in 2002, 2006 and 2009. Rollins has been featured in the top 50 of the Official World Golf Ranking and is a product of MCC's rich heritage of junior golfers.



Adam Ball ranked as high as No. 2 nationally in the Golfweek U.S. Junior Rankings in 2011. Three-time Virginia Golf Association (VSGA) Junior Golfer of the Year. He is the first four-time VSGA Junior Champion in history, including match and stroke play titles in 2012. Adam also ranked 8th as a quarter finalist the 113th annual USGA Amateur championship.

Lyberty Anderson, Female Junior Golfer of the Year, 2011, won the 36th VSGA Virginias Women's Stroke Play Championship, 2013. She is a four-time winner of the Richmond Women's Golf Association Amateur Championship, and the first female recipient of the Joe Cheves Memorial Scholarship.
